

Women in the Genealogy of Jesus, the Messiah (Matthew 1)



TABOR

From Genesis 38 ~ Judah had three sons: Er, Oman, and Shelah. Judah found a wife for Er whose name was Tabor, but in the Lord's sight, Er was wicked so the Lord put him to death. Following the custom, Judah gave Tabor to second-son Onan to carry the family line, but Onan refused since the child would not be considered his own, so the Lord put him to death.

Judah promised Tabor that youngest-son Shelah would be her husband when he grew up, and she lived as widow in Judah's home to wait. But when Shelah grew up, she was not given to him. When Judah's wife died, and he ended his grieving, he sought a prostitute. To secure her future, Tabor dressed as one, covered her face and sat on the road to Timnah where she knew he would pass by.

Bathsheba

2 Samuel 11 ~ In the spring, when kings go off to war, David sent the entire Israelite army to destroy the Ammonites, but David remained in Jerusalem, and one evening, walking along his roof, he saw a very beautiful woman bathing and sent someone to find out who she was. "She is Bathsheba, the daughter of Eliam and wife of Uriah the Hittite," he was told. But David sent someone to bring her to him, and she became pregnant.

David had her husband return from battle so he could sleep with his wife and claim this unborn child, but Uriah was an honorable man and refused to do so while his men were still on the battlefield, so David conspired to have him placed at the front of the battle, and Uriah the Hittite was killed. When Bathsheba heard this, she mourned for him. But after the time of mourning was over, David had her brought to his house and she became his wife. All that David had done displeased the Lord.

A Reflection ~

When you despair that your life is small (insignificant), when you grieve that your life is troubled (or a mess), when you doubt your life's benefit to the universe, remember that no matter your faults (or your last name or where you were born), regardless of your disappointments (failures, broken promises) you are more than this one individual flesh: you are part of this vast, wondrous humanity, this glorious Creation, part of God's healing of the world. Your life, your whole life, is beautiful and worthy, (Holy) and belongs to God.
